Speaker Biographies

Amanda Blanks is the Investor Education Coordinator for the Virginia Division of Securities and Retail Franchising. The Virginia Division of Securities and Retail Franchising is responsible for the regulation of securities, broker-dealers, broker-dealer agents, investment advisers and their representatives. It is also responsible for the registration of franchises and trademarks in Virginia. The Division answers inquiries, provides investor education programs, handles complaints, performs audits, and conducts investigations regarding any code violation or misconduct relating to Securities and Retail Franchising.

Jane Brown is a teacher of Family & Consumer Sciences at Powhatan High School in Powhatan, Va., where she has been for the past 5 years. She is a co-adviser for Powhatan's Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA), and her students have won national awards for their projects dealing with financial fitness and education. Brown is a national program adviser for Family Economics and Financial Education (FEFE) and has participated in their curriculum writing programs. Before becoming a teacher, she worked 20 years in sales and marketing management.

Brown has been recognized by Who's Who Among Americas Teachers for the past four years and has also received the national FCCLA Spirit of Advising Award. She is a member of Delta Kappa Gamma and the Virginia Association of Teachers of Family and Consumer Sciences. She received her bachelor's degree at Virginia Tech and is currently earning her master's degree in education from Longwood University.

Joe Clement is a teacher of Economics, Government and AP Economics at Chantilly High School in Fairfax County, Va. He wrote the Program of Studies for the County's semester course in Economics. Clement has traveled to Russia with the National Council on Economic Education (NCEE), coached eight teams in the Fed Challenge and has coached three state champion teams in the Economics Challenge.

Clement received his bachelor's degree in economics from James Madison University, and a master's in education from George Mason University.

Dianna Clouse oversees the Contact Center Member Solutions Outreach at Virginia Credit Union (VACU) in Richmond, Va. She has more than 27 years experience in the financial industry, and has been with VACU for 21 years where she is dedicated to helping members with their financial needs.

Clouse is also passionate about promoting financial literacy. In the last 11 years, she has made more than 250 personal finance presentations to students and instructors. She serves on the Financial Literacy Committee of the Richmond Chapter of Credit Unions, Virginia Credit Union League Financial Literacy Volunteer Board, Virginia Life Smarts Competition and Virginia Jumpstart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy.

Ruth Cookson is the Program Manager for the Old Dominion University Center for Economic Education in Norfolk, Va. She conducts workshops and develops curriculum for K-12 teachers, helping them to better integrate economics into their lessons. In 2005 she earned the National Council on Economic Education's Rookie of the Year award and has presented at numerous state and national conferences since 1996.

A former high school teacher, Cookson taught social studies at Granby High School in Norfolk for 10 years. She earned her M.S. in education from Old Dominion University in 1990.

Dayle Disque is a teacher of Personal Finance and Honors Algebra II at Sherando High School in Frederick County, Va., where she has been working for 22 years. She led the team that wrote the original curriculum map for Personal Finance in Frederick County five years ago and updates it yearly with teacher input.

Disque provides workshops to other teachers on how to deliver a Personal Finance course that engages students in an application-based class. During her Personal Finance semester course, approximately 25% of the time includes students actively participating in computer-based instruction and online, interactive activities. Disque also serves as the Lead Mentor for Sherando High and is the proud mother of four children.

Kimberly Edmonds is a Family and Consumer Studies Extension Agent with Virginia Cooperative Extension in Henrico County, Va. As an off-campus faculty member of Virginia Tech, she is responsible for conducting educational programs in the area of financial management and consumer issues. Over the past six years, she has presented financial topics to various audiences including professional development organizations, youth serving organizations teachers, and the general public. Prior to her employment at the organization, she served as a volunteer financial counselor with Virginia Cooperative Extension.

Edmonds serves on various boards including the Henrico County Head Start Policy Council, the Greater Richmond Earned Income Credit Coalition, LifeSmarts Coalition and the American Association of Retired Persons Community Council, Metro Richmond. Kimberly received a bachelor's degree in housing, interior design and resource management (consumer studies) from Virginia Tech and a master's degree in urban studies from Old Dominion University.

Kari Hancock is a teacher of Business and Personal Finance at William Byrd High School of Roanoke County Public Schools in Vinton, Va. She has been at William Byrd High since 2005 and in addition to teaching serves as the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) Advisor. Hancock has increased enrollment from one class her first year to a current enrollment of three full classes, with 25 students in each class.

A native of Salem, Va., Hancock completed her bachelor's degree in marketing education at Utah State University. While in college, she was a State Vice-President for DECA in the state of Utah and travelled extensively throughout the state attending local seminars and observing local DECA units. After graduating in 2005, she completed the Oracle Academy Certification, and is also Mandt Trained.

R. Michael Hedden, AAI is the Senior Vice President of Bank Relations for Bankers Insurance, LLC in Richmond, Va. In this role, he works closely with the agency owner banks to increase their insurance sales to customer by developing specific strategies and goals. The role includes fostering a relationship and team approach between the owner banks, the agency, and the respective employees. Hedden worked closely with the development and creation of Bankers Insurance in 1999 while serving as a staff member of the Virginia Bankers Association (VBA). Since that time, the agency has grown to be one of the largest agencies based in Virginia, with 12 office locations and more than 160 employees.

Hedden joined the VBA in March 1997 after working as an agency underwriter in the commercial property and casualty division of Travelers Insurance. He holds the Accredited Adviser in Insurance (AAI) designation, and received his bachelor's degree in finance from James Madison University.

R. Darryl Holland is a teacher of Agriculture at Magna Vista High School in Henry County, Va. For the past four years, he has taught Agricultural Mechanics, Natural Resource Management, Forestry and Wildlife, Animal Science, Introduction to Veterinary Science, Beginning Equestrian Studies and Plant Science for the past four years. Prior to his tenure at Magna Vista, Holland taught for 23 years at Laurel Park High School in Henry County.

In 1995, Holland's program submitted a state-winning Check Excellence application, presented by the Virginia Board of Education in recognition of "Operation: Barbwire," a student financial management project involving livestock and student loans. In 1999, this same program won the "Rufus W. Beamer Excellence Award" from the Virginia Board of Education. Over the past 14 years, Holland's students have borrowed and paid back more than \$100,000 in low interest loans from the Federal government's Farm Service Agency Youth Loan program, where students keep profits for cattle, sheep, hog, goat and coonhound projects. He received his bachelors' degree in animal science and agricultural education from Virginia Tech, and a master's of education from Texas A & M University.

Tina Lambert, CAE is the Vice President of Member & Public Relations of the Virginia Society of Certified Public Accountants (VSCPA) in Richmond, Va., and serves as Chair of the Board of Directors for the Virginia Jump\$tart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy. Because of the VSCPA's commitment to financial education, Lambert led the creation of the Virginia Jump\$tart Coalition in 2005 and her organization commits ongoing resources to support the Coalition's mission and goals. In her role at the VSCPA, Lambert oversees strategies for member outreach, public relations and community service; print and online communications; student and educator programs (www.cpastudentzone.com); and the VSCPA's award-winning financial literacy program called Financial Fitness (www.financialfitness.org).

A Certified Association Executive (CAE), Lambert's volunteer activities include serving on the Association/Nonprofit Executive Committee of the Public Relations Society of America (PRSA); treasurer of the PRSA Richmond Chapter Board of Directors; and member of the Communications Council of the American Society for Association Executives (ASAE). She holds the Institute for Organization Management (IOM) designation, a four-year nonprofit leadership program of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. She received her bachelor's degree in history and communications from University of Virginia's College at Wise, and earned her master's degree in mass communications from Virginia Commonwealth University.

George Lyle, AIE, CIC, CPCU is the Insurance Outreach Coordinator of Property Casualty Division at the Virginia Bureau of Insurance in Richmond, Va. The Bureau licenses, regulates, investigates and examines insurance companies, agencies and agents on behalf of the citizens of the Commonwealth of Virginia. He joined the Bureau in 1980 as a trainee, assistant supervisor and later promoted to supervisor of the Market Conduct Section, and has worked as Insurance Outreach Coordinator since 2002.

Lyle is a Chartered Property and Casualty Underwriter (CPCU), an Accredited Insurance Examiner (AIE), a Certified Insurance Counselor (CIC), and he also holds the Associate in Management (AIM) certification. Prior to coming to the Bureau, he was an independent insurance agent for two years. He has a bachelor's degree in finance/insurance from Virginia Tech.

Courtney Malveaux, J.D. is an Assistant Attorney General in the Office of Virginia Attorney General Bob McDonnell in Richmond, Va. As an Adjunct Professor, he has taught Forensic Evidence at the Virginia Commonwealth University, and he now teaches Law Skills that the University of Richmond School of Law. Malveaux serves as President of the Richmond Chapter of the Old Dominion Bar Association, and Vice Chairman of the Board for the Martin Luther King, Jr. Living History and Public Policy Center. He also serves on the Board of the Greater Richmond Bar Foundation and the William and Mary School of Law Alumni Association.

Before practicing as an attorney, Malveaux worked as a legislative assistant and directed the Attorney General's Task Force on Gangs and Youth Violence and Virginia's Future, a statewide mentoring initiative for youth. He has also served on the Public Safety Panel for the Wilder-Bliley Commission for the City of Richmond and has volunteered as a mentor with Big Brothers/Big Sisters and with Lunch Buddies. Malveaux received his bachelor's degree in sociology at Pennsylvania State University, his master's in political management at George Washington University and law degree from William and Mary School of Law.

The Honorable Bob McDonnell was elected the 44th Attorney General of Virginia on November 8, 2005. He was inaugurated to this new post on January 14, 2006. As Attorney General of Virginia, McDonnell focuses on issues that will keep Virginia safe and strong, including a 25-year mandatory minimum sentence for violent sexual predators, cracking down on dealers who sell drugs to children, protecting Virginians from threats of terror, internet crimes and identity theft.

Before his election as Attorney General, McDonnell represented the 84th District in the Virginia House of Delegates for 14 years. In the House of Delegates, McDonnell served as Chairman of the House Courts of Justice Committee, which acts upon nearly 20 percent of the legislation introduced in the House. Prior to being elected to the House of Delegates in 1991, Attorney General McDonnell served as a prosecutor in the Virginia Beach Commonwealth's Attorneys office. Attorney General McDonnell served 21 years in the U.S. Army, both active duty and reserves, and retired as a Lt. Colonel. He was also a partner at the law firm of Huff, Poole & Mahoney, P.C for 14 years. He holds a bachelor's degree in management from Notre Dame, a master's of science degree in business administration from Boston University, and a master's and law degree from Regent University.

The Honorable Thomas Morris began serving as Secretary of Education for the Commonwealth of Virginia in the Administration of Governor Timothy M. Kaine on January 15, 2006. Prior to his appointment within the Governor's Cabinet, Secretary Morris served as the president of Emory & Henry College for more than 13 years. A distinguished Constitutional scholar and political scientist, he was a distinguished faculty member at the University of Richmond for 21 years. During his teaching career at the University of Richmond, Secretary Morris was selected to leadership posts and honored for excellence in the classroom. He was honored as a University Distinguished Educator, received many faculty research grants, and served as chair of the Faculty Council.

Secretary Morris is widely known as an expert on Virginia government and politics. He is the author or co-author of four books, including "Virginia Government and Politics: Readings and Comments, Fourth Revised Edition," a 1998 work co-edited with Larry Sabato of the University of Virginia. He has also written 17 major articles or book chapters. Secretary Morris earned a bachelor's degree in government at Virginia Military Institute, studied at Princeton University, then completed master's and doctoral degrees in government at the University of Virginia. He received fellowships for

additional advanced study including a year as a Liberal Arts Fellow at the Harvard Law School and a year as a fellow of the National Endowment for the Humanities at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Tim Schilling is the Associate Director for Programs at the Powell Center for Economic Literacy in Richmond, Va. He joined the Powell Center in 2007 after serving as Director of Education and Outreach at the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago for nine years.

Schilling's volunteer leadership activities include roles at the National Association of Economic Educators, Indiana and Wisconsin Councils on Economic Education, Illinois Jump\$tart Coalition and Illinois Governors Task Force on Financial Literacy, among others. He is a member of the National Association of Economic Educators, National Business Education Association and National Council for the Social Studies. He received his bachelor's degree in history from Michigan State University and his master's degree in history from Central Michigan University.

James Shepherd, CPA, PFS, CFP®, is a principal in the Kuehl Shepherd Kozlowski Group in Richmond, Va., which consists of the affiliated financial firms of Kuehl Shepherd & Associates, PC, CPAs, Investment Consultants and Management Company of Virginia (a registered investment advisor) and KSKA Insurance Consultants, Inc. He is a certified public accountant (CPA), personal financial specialist (PFS) and a certified financial planner (CFP®).

Shepherd is an active member of the Virginia Society of Certified Public Accountants (VSCPA), where he serves on the Finance Committee, Vice Chair on the Educational Foundation Board of Directors and is active presenter on financial literacy topics in the CPA Speakers Bureau. He's also a member of the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) and Financial Planning Association (FPA). Shepherd received his bachelor's of science degree from Virginia Tech, a post baccalaureate certificate in accounting from Virginia Commonwealth University and a master's degree in financial planning from the College for Financial Planning.

Lis Turner is an Economic Education Specialist at the Federal Reserve Bank of Richmond. She has worked in economic education for more than 9 years, but has been at the Federal Reserve for 30 years.

Turner is active in Junior Achievement and Virginia Jump\$tart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy, and especially enjoys working with elementary school teachers and students.

Linda Wallinger, Ph.D. is the Assistant Superintendent for Instruction at the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE), located in Richmond, Va. Working at the VDOE since 1998, she oversees the offices of elementary, middle and high school instruction; career and technical education; federal programs; and adult education and literacy. Previously, Dr. Wallinger served as director of the office of program administration and accountability and the office of high school instruction, and associate director of teacher quality enhancement and foreign languages and English as a second language. Prior to joining VDOE, she was a middle school administrator in Hanover County and a French teacher in Botetourt and Henrico Counties in Virginia.

Dr. Wallinger has studied extensively in francophone countries, and won numerous awards for excellence in teaching and contributions to school leadership. At the VDOE, she has worked on numerous projects for the Virginia General Assembly and the Virginia Board of Education, and works closely with the Governor's office to accomplish the educational goals of the administration. Currently Dr. Wallinger plays a key role in addressing the Kaine administration's interest in moving from competence to excellence, especially in the areas of early childhood education, adolescent literacy and high school completion. Dr. Wallinger holds a bachelor's degree in french and an Ed.S. and Ph.D. in educational policy, planning and leadership from The College of William and Mary. She earned a master's of education in school administration from the University of Virginia.

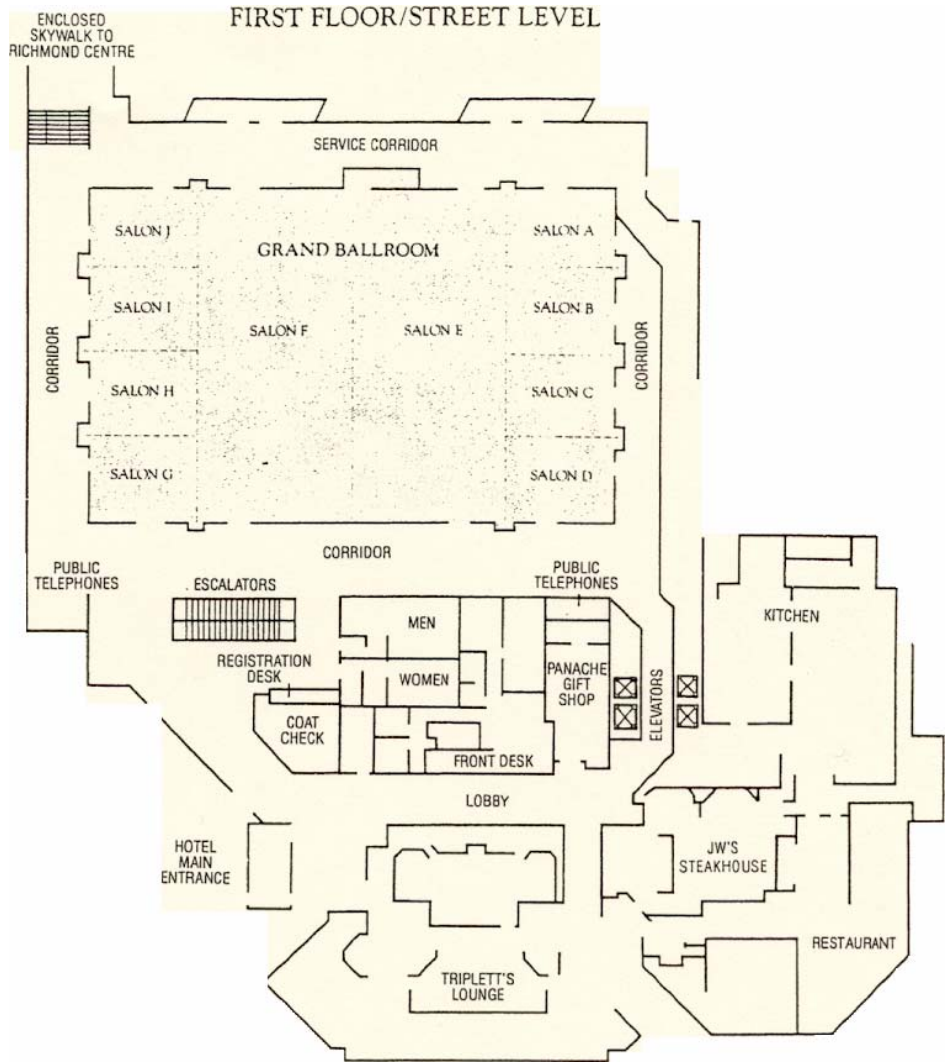
I-64 West:

If you are driving West on I-64, take the 5th Street/Coliseum Exit. You will be on 5th Street. Follow 5th Street for 3/4 mile, and get in the far left lane. Take a left onto E. Marshall Street. The parking deck is located at 5th and Marshall – directly behind the Marriott. A skywalk connects the garage to the Marriott.

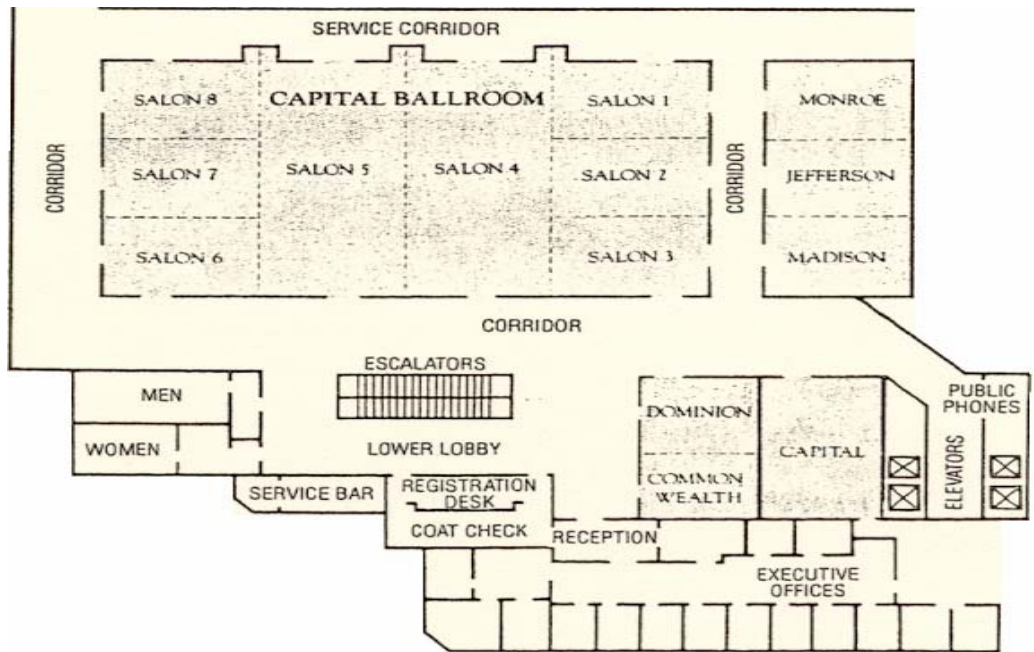
