

Starting this Fall, Our Online Services are Changing

When we're done with the transition, taxpayers will be able to file, pay, and manage all of their taxes with us in one place.

This will be a 4-year implementation process, with different taxes moving to our new, modernized Online Services platform each year. We'll be maintaining multiple systems for a few years. Our goal is to minimize disruptions during this transition as we improve and modernize our systems.

Businesses will see the changes first:

September 2026

Businesses will be able to transition their existing online accounts (iFile) to our new Online Services platform to file the following taxes:

- ▶ Sales taxes
- ▶ Employer withholding taxes
- ▶ Vending machine dealer's tax
- ▶ Digital media fee
- ▶ Tire recycling fee

November 2026

Businesses who use an online account (iFile) to file or pay these taxes will need to do so using our new Online Services platform.

Other online filing options, including eForms and Web Upload, will continue to be available on our website.

* We encourage impacted businesses to start using the new platform in September!



What's also coming in September

Tax professionals with an existing tax preparer online account (iFile) will also be able to transition their account using their current credentials.

New businesses that need to register with us will do so using our new Online Services platform.

Existing businesses will use the new platform to make changes to their Virginia Tax business accounts. They can also use the new platform to make payments on bills they've received from us.

What's coming later

Once we've migrated sales and withholding taxes to the new platform, we'll move to other taxes.

Corporate income tax, pass-through entity income tax (PTE), individual income tax, and other miscellaneous taxes will transition in later rollouts.
